

- The encyclopedia of volcanoes



# From the Map Room - Mineral deposits map of Central Asia


Most of the maps in the Geological Society's 40,000+ strong collection are straightforward stratigraphic geological maps. We do, however, have some maps with different thematic content.

The Library has recently acquired the 2009 <u>Mineral deposits map of Central Asia</u>, made by the CERCAMs project and the Natural History Museum, and published by the International Geoscience Programme. It's an amazingly detailed map, over 110x170 cm in size, giving not only the geology of the "-stans" but also indicating known mineral deposits throughout the area.

## New e-book - Geology and resource potential of the Congo Basin


<u>Geology and resource potential of the Congo Basin</u> has been added to the Library's e-book collection, free for Fellows.

## Get to know your Library - come for a tour


