



From the Map Room - 1:250,000 maps of Iran




The Map Room holds many treasures, old and new. As part of a regular feature in the Library newsletter we'll be focusing on a different map or map series, to give you an insight into the breadth of what we hold and an overview of the collection as a whole.

Created in the 1970s, the 1:250,000 series of geological maps of Iran cover more than 50% of the country in detail. Published by the Geological Survey of Iran, many of the sheets have accompanying texts in English. All are available for loan to Fellows of the Society and Corporate Affiliate members, either in person or by post.


