New geological maps - Sudan and Yemen


The Library has recently received two sets of maps that fill gaps in our collection, thanks to the generous donation of their creator, Dr Mike Hammill.

The first is full coverage of Sudan (including South Sudan) at a scale of 1:1,000,000 (15 sheets in total) published in the 1990s. We previously had a few of these sheets, but the full set is now unavailable for purchase.

Dr Hammill has also donated all sheets from the <u>Geological Map of Yemen</u> from the 1990s at a scale of 1:250,000 (35 sheets in total).

Deep Shale Oil and Gas has been added to the Library's e-book collection, free for Fellows.

This practical handbook provides an introduction to shale gas resources as well as a basic understanding of the geomechanical properties of shale, the need for hydraulic fracturing, and an indication of shale gas processing. It also examines the issues regarding the nature of shale gas development, potential environmental impacts, and the ability of the current regulatory structure to deal with these issues.



Open Access E-books - Norway and the Arctic

The Geological Survey of Norway has recently published two e-books which are freely available online.

Mineral Resources in the Arctic contains all available information on the most important metal and diamond deposits in the Arctic, which includes 28 diamond deposits and 207 large, very large and potentially large metal deposits, in regions north of 60°N in eight countries in the Arctic.


