

Library Event - F is for Fake!


We are delighted to present the Library's next event, 'F is for Fake', on Thursday 6 April.

After each talk there will be an opportunity to look at our special exhibition of Beringer's 'fossils', on loan from the Oxford University Museum of Natural History and the Natural History Museum, as well at the Society's famous painting 'Discussion on the Piltdown Skull'.

Geological map of Myanmar donated to the Library

The Map Room has recently been donated the <u>1:2,250,000 scale map of</u> <u>Myanmar</u>, published in 2014. If you are interested in consulting it, or other maps in the Library's collection, please <u>contact the Map Librarian</u>.

This map was purchased in the country by one of our Fellows and is currently unavailable outside of Myanmar. There are many such examples of maps which we can only obtain them through the kindness of our members. We may be able to add it to the Society's collection.

Library collections exhibited in Milan

We are delighted that a number of items from the Society's special collections are on display in a new exhibition at MUDEC, Milan's Museum of Culture.

<u>Rex and the city: Saurians and us</u> explores the history of the human association of dinosaurs with dragons, chimeras and other mythical creatures. Among the 9 items loaned by the Library are drawings and lithographs relating to Mary Anning's discovery of Jurassic marine reptiles, cartoons by Henry De la Beche, and our drawing and advertisement for the 'Human Fossil or antediluvian child' which was exhibited in Leicester Square in 1840.
