



A fossil drawing masterclass with Ted Nield



Following on from the popularity of our first public event in July, on Thursday 6 November the Upper Library played host to 'Ghosts of the Museum: An Elementary Class on Fossils and How to Draw Them'.

Again the event was sold out quickly, and 24 lucky 'pupils' were treated to a class on how to draw fossils correctly in a scientific manner by the curator for the evening Edward Charlesworth, aka Dr Ted Nield, author and editor of *Geoscientist*.

Resplendent for the occasion in his academic robes, and using specimens on loan from the Natural History Museum, the curator demonstrated the principles of drawing trilobites, brachiopods, gastropods and echinoderms (the latter through the novel idea of using a football lunch bag).

Library inductions for Fellows





Spare journal issues to give away




The Library holds a number of duplicate copies of journals that are available free of charge.

Free BGS maps available online



The British Geological Survey have made scans of much of their mapping available to view online for free.

The BGS Maps Portal provides high resolution viewing images of almost all small and medium scale maps produced by the British Geological Survey since mapping started in 1832.

Some of the highlights of this huge resource include:

- Historical 1" to the mile UK maps
- the most recent 1:50,000 sheets for England & Wales, and Scotland
- Ireland sheets up to 1905
- 1:25,000 Classical Areas of British Geology series
- 1:250,000 offshore mapping series

Maps can be browsed by <u>region</u> or <u>subject</u>, and there are also <u>quick links</u> to the latest available 1:50,000 sheets. The portal also includes information on the <u>history of geological mapping</u> and the origins of the Geological Survey.
