



Online special issues





New Russian and Ugandan digital maps




For the first time, the Library has obtained geological mapping for various cities in Russia, Ukraine and Georgia at 1:200,000 scale. We now have digital images for Moscow, St. Petersburg, Tblisi, Kiev and Odessa at this scale and hope to extend our coverage next year. For details on how to view and use these maps, please contact the Map Librarian.

The Geological Survey of Finland, in close co-operation with the Department of Geological Survey and Mines, Entebbe, has produced a new 1:1million scale Geological Map of Uganda. Both the map and

accompanying text, *Geology and geodynamic development of Uganda* (GTK Special Paper 55), are available to borrow from the Library, while a digital version of the map is <u>freely available online</u>.

If you wish to visit any of these libraries, please <u>contact us first</u> so that we can make an appointment on your behalf.


